## Question A

According to the second paragraph, inbound tourism to Japan <u>contributes</u> / <u>is essential</u> to revitalizing its economy. Approximately 3 million foreign tourists visited Japan in March 2024. The Japanese government now expects <u>to achieve</u> / <u>to reach</u> its goal of welcoming 32 million tourists to the country by 2025.

## Question B

The situation in which a local area's capacity and infrastructure are negatively affected by <u>too many visitors</u> / <u>a rise in the number of tourists</u> is known as overtourism. ## Question C

I agree with the government's push for more inbound tourism because it will help rebuild Japan. I think the government should stop pushing for more inbound tourism. Some areas simply don't have the necessary infrastructure in place. For example, I have heard complaints from foreign visitors to Niseko ski area that, although the snow is great, restaurants are full and bus service is poor. Overtourism is also affecting the daily life of local residents. In Sapporo, public transportation can be crowded with tourists with large suitcases, making it difficult for local people to commute to work. For a better experience for everyone, there should be fewer tourists, not more. (93 words)
